# WHO'S WHO



#### C. Paul Heins, GenOUT Director

C. Paul Heins joined the GMCW artistic team as associate conductor in the 2014 – 15 season. Dr. Heins was previously the director of the Concert Choir at Georgetown University, where he also taught music theory, piano, and introduction to voice, and served as music director for the university's opera and musical theater productions. He served as director of the Lesbian & Gay Chorus of Washington for nine seasons and was music director for three GMCW musicals (*Ruthless, When Pigs Fly*, and *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*). Past appointments also include the Washington Master Chorale (assistant conductor), Washington Men's Camerata (accompanist/associate conductor), and an interim position

as choir director at the College of William & Mary.

Dr. Heins's principal role with the GMCW is directing the GenOUT Chorus, an outreach ensemble for LGBTQ+ and allied youth founded in 2015. Under Dr. Heins's leadership, GenOUT has grown from its inaugural class of nine singers to a current enrollment of 25 representing 16 schools in DC, Maryland, and Virginia. Over the past three years, more than 60 students from nearly three dozen schools have participated in GenOUT Chorus and Camps, and notable performance venues have included the John F. Kennedy Center, the White House, Washington National Cathedral, and the 2016 GALA Choruses Festival in Denver.

Dr. Heins is a frequent guest pianist, flutist, and conductor in the DC area. He was trained in piano and flute at Bowling Green State University (B.Mus.), flute at the University of Maryland (M.Mus.), and choral conducting at the University of Maryland (D.M.A.). His principal teachers have been Edward Maclary, Patrick Walders, and Mark S. Kelly (conducting); William Montgomery and Judith Bentley (flute); and Virginia Marks and Victoria Harris (piano). His doctoral work centered around Lukas Foss's cantata, *The Prairie*.



# Greg Watkins, The MusicianShip Washington Youth Choir Director

Greg Watkins is a born and bred Washington, DC native. He is considered by many to be a well-respected artist and virtuoso of his generation. He is a proud graduate of the Duke Ellington School of the Arts and Howard University (B.M. Music Education). Greg's undeniably sharp skills in musical direction have landed him opportunities to perform in productions alongside such celebrated artists as Debbie Allen, Linda Eder, e'Marcus Harper, Lynda Gravatt, Clay Aiken, Brian McKnight, Jennifer Holliday, Hinton Battle, and Wendy Raquel Robinson. His gifts as a trained singer and pianist have planted him on historic stages including DC's

Warner Theatre, Lincoln Theatre, Howard Theatre, Ford's Theatre, Music Center at Strathmore, Washington National Cathedral, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, the White House, and the Grand Philharmonic Hall in St. Petersburg, Russia. Approaching his eighth year of musical service, Greg continues to serve as The MusicianShip Washington Youth Choir's Music Director.

#### About the GenOUT Chorus:

The GenOUT Chorus was founded as an outreach ensemble of the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, DC in January 2015. Membership is open to all youth, LGBTQ+ and allies, ages 13 – 18, and new members may join at the start of each concert cycle (September, January, and April). The two-fold mission of the GenOUT Chorus is to give young LGBTQ+ and allied youth a voice and to connect that voice to community.

In its first four seasons, the GenOUT Chorus has performed at the Lincoln Theatre, the John F. Kennedy Center, the White House, Washington National Cathedral, and the 2016 GALA Choruses Festival in Denver. GenOUT is delighted to return to the Atlas Performing Arts Center for its second annual *Youth Invasion* concert.

Each summer, GenOUT hosts a weeklong summer camp to welcome new members, learn music, explore important LGBTQ+ topics, and have fun! GenOUT Camp always includes a field trip and concludes with a performance for the community. This year's camp will be held at Clarendon Presbyterian Church the week of July 16 – 20, 2018.
