ABOUT GENOUT

The GenOUT Youth Chorus is the Washington, DC area's only vocal ensemble for LGBTQ+ and allied youth. An outreach ensemble of the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, DC, GenOUT operates under a two-fold mission: to give LGBTQ+ and allied youth a voice through song, and to connect that voice to the community. The ensemble is open to all singers between the ages of 13 and 18. Since its debut in spring 2015, nearly 140 singers from over 80 schools have participated in GenOUT. In addition to *Youth Invasion* and mainstage shows with GMCW, GenOUT maintains an active calendar of outreach performances, singing at such venues as the Kennedy Center, Washington National Cathedral, the White House, the Library of Congress, GALA Choruses Festival, and the national conference of the American Choral Directors Association, plus numerous faith communities, schools, and public events around the DMV area. This year, GenOUT has been nominated for two awards from the Choralis Foundation, in the categories of "Proactive Community Outreach" and "Best Educational Outreach."

ABOUT SEASONS OF LOVE

Seasons of Love is a small ensemble of the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington, DC. This diverse group specializes in R&B, pop, gospel, and inspirational music. The ensemble's name is taken from the musical *Rent*, while also summing up the group's message to inspire listeners to experience love, passion, and inspiration through the power of music. Seasons of Love performs regularly around the DC metro area and beyond. Past outreach performances by Seasons of Love have included appearances at many churches in the DC metro area; concerts at Luray Caverns and Wolf Trap; a performance live on FOX5DC *Good Day DC*; and various Pride Nights including for the Washington Wizards and the first-ever performance by an LGBTQ+ chorus at an NFL game when they performed for the Washington Commanders.

C. Paul Heins, GenOUT Youth Chorus Director (he/him)

C. Paul Heins joined the GMCW artistic team in the 2014 – 2015 season. As Associate Conductor, one of his chief responsibilities has been the direction of the GenOUT Youth Chorus. When it debuted in January 2015, GenOUT became the sixth queer and allied youth chorus in the country; it is now a leader among a network of ten, with more than 140 singers from over 80 schools participating in the program over nine seasons.

Before joining GMCW, Dr. Heins was the director of the Concert Choir at Georgetown University and of the Lesbian

& Gay Chorus of Washington. He trained in piano and flute at Bowling Green State University (B.Mus.), flute at the University of Maryland (M.Mus.), and choral conducting at the University of Maryland (D.M.A.). His principal teachers were Edward Maclary, Patrick Walders, and Mark S. Kelly (conducting); William Montgomery and Judith Bentley (flute); and Virginia Marks and Victoria Harris (piano). His doctoral research focused on Lukas Foss's 1942 cantata *The Prairie*.

Dr. Heins is a frequent guest pianist, flutist, conductor, and presenter in the DC area. He serves on the boards of the Cathedral Choral Society and the MD/DC state chapter of ACDA, as well as the LGBTQ+ Steering Committee for DC Public Schools and the Community Advisory Board for the CDC's Prevention Research Center at the University of Maryland.



Ronté Pierce, Seasons of Love Director (he/him)

Ronté Pierce brings over 33 years of singing, performing, and directing experience with faith-based, community, academic, and choral vocal ensembles, as well as experience with musical theater and opera to his position as the director of the Seasons of Love ensemble.

Ronté's musical journey began in Durham, NC, where he participated in the children's choir of his childhood church. It was there that his love of singing and directing gospel music was cultivated and he eventually started a successful singing group, served as a worship leader, and directed

three choirs at his home church.

Ronté's musical experiences with his childhood church inspired him to study voice at North Carolina Central University (NCCU) in Durham, NC. He was a member of the NCCU Concert Choir, NCCU Touring Choir, NCCU Vocal Jazz Ensemble, and NCCU Opera Workshop. Upon receiving a Bachelor of Arts in Music, he began a teaching career with the hopes of inspiring others to express themselves with music.

Ronté currently serves as one of three music teachers at Jackson-Reed High School in Washington, DC where he directs a successful choir program. He believes that the best teachers are those who continue to engage in the learning process, which has led him to pursue and receive a Master of Music degree from Boston University (2012) and an Education Specialist degree from Grand Canyon University (2021).



Pam Sommers, Chords of Glory Director (she/her)

Director Pam Sommers, a conservatory-trained pianist, began her career as a performing arts critic for *The Washington Post*. She then turned to teaching middle school music and drama at Capitol Hill Day School, Milton Gottesman Jewish Day School, and the Maret School, where Chords of Glory was first created. Pam is currently an educator and Teen Programs Coordinator at Adat Shalom Reconstructionist Congregation. She is a member of PEARL 4.0, a treble voice quartet; and Capital Accord Chorus, a Sweet Adelines a cappella group.
